

- Benevolent and Outreach Committee. There are two positions open. This ministry team works on organizing the Missional projects of the Church, updating the sign outside and looking at ways to provide Outreach/Evangelism in the community.
- Care and Hospitality Committee. There are three positions open. This ministry team works to recognize, Graduates, newborns and other highlights in our Church family. They organize and oversee the Widow/Widower Luncheon and look to welcome new people into the congregation. This team helps to organize church wide fellowship and other opportunities for "Family Care".

Would the 2024 Consistory please come forward?

Jesus Christ is Lord of His church. Founded upon the conviction that He is the Son of God, redeemed by His blood, nourished upon His Word, upheld by His intercession, the church is His body, commissioned to do His will.

Christ did not set up His church and then abandoned her. Rather, He sent His Holy Spirit to guide the apostles into all truth, so that the body would have all it needed to do the work Christ intended and also be protected from those forces which would destroy her.

Elders were named in each congregation and given oversight in spiritual matters. Paul speaks of this responsibility in his charge to the elders from the church of Ephesus:

Be on your guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. (Acts 20:28)

An elder's work may include preaching and teaching, as in 1 Timothy 5:17; praying with the sick, as in James 5:14; shepherding the flock, as in 1 Peter 5:2-3 and also serving as a good example.

The word deacon means servant, and perhaps the word itself offers the best description of the deacon's ministry. As the elders minister to the spiritual welfare of the flock, so the deacons must minister to its material needs.

When a complaint arose in the Jerusalem church that certain widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food, the church selected seven men and the apostles turned the responsibilities over to them. (Acts 6)

This immediate and practical solution pleased everyone. The widows' needs were met; the apostles were able to concentrate on prayer and teaching; the incipient division was healed; and the church increased in numbers rapidly.

So it is today. The various ministries in the church complement each other and benefit the whole.

The elders see that the gospel is preached, taught, and lived; that prayer is continuous; that Christian love and a spirit of unity prevail; that workers are selected and trained; that the straying is brought back into the fold; and that the kingdom of Christ extends abroad.

Deacons, assist in the many areas of ministry. From their service in worship to encouraging others, assisting elders in the ministry function of the church, considering needs in our midst, and bringing them to the attention of elders and trustees. Deacons assist the Pastor in being additional eyes and ears, hands and feet in the ministry of the congregation. Deacons also consider that none in the congregation suffers a lack of food, clothing, or shelter.

Trustees see to the physical matters of the church, that facilities are available and equipped, that property is well maintained, and that financial affairs are above reproach. That the church is accessible and usable by all who wish to come and worship.

We have come today to set apart those we have selected to serve this congregation as its elders, deacons, and trustees. Let us ask God's blessings upon these individuals, that His name may be honored and His will be done.

Having prayerfully considered your nomination to your respective positions, and having been voted upon and received by the membership of the body we now ask you these questions.

Are you prepared to serve in your position?

Response: I am, with the help of God.

Do you promise to exercise your ministry diligently and faithfully, showing forth the love of Christ?

Response: I am, with the help of God.

Members of this household of faith, having heard the commitments of these individuals, are you willing to encourage, assist, and pray for with and for these individuals as they lead this congregation?

Response: We will, with the help of God.
