Dear Church Family,

Consistory President, Mark Elsass, called the meeting to order.

Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer.

SECRETARY REPORT:

Terri Goodwin read the Secretary's Report from May 2023 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio.

Ned Meyer moved to accept the minutes.

Matt Wick seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT:

Ginger Holtkamp reviewed the treasurer report for the period ending May 31, 2023.

The beginning balance was \$63,116.70.

Miscellaneous decreases totaled \$1,387.09.

Checks and payments cleared equaled \$4,493.47, and deposits and credits totaled equaled \$11,189.74 for a cleared balance of \$64,788.59.

Page 2 showed an un-cleared balance of \$63,693.43.

Page 3 showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$63.565.91.

Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of May.

Total Income was \$7,763.64. The expense total was \$7,259.43, for a net loss/gain of \$504.21.

Page 5 showed all bills for the month of June.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled \$4,612.10. Bills yet to be paid totaled \$1,411.26, and the total is \$6,023.36.

Parker Manger moved to accept the report and to pay all bills for the month.

Dave Kettler seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TRUSTEE REPORT:

Ned Meyer reported:

Posts for South Side Church Entrance have been installed. Trustees will open church and clean through July 1st while Katie is gone. Items gathered during "spring clean-up" will be displayed at a future date. No follow-up on the insurance policy at this time.

PASTOR'S REPORT:
