During Covid-19. I spoke of CPR. It stood for Call, Pray, and Report. We did this as a Church Community to keep our connection strong and to check on the needs of those around



us. We still need CPR in our community of faith. It should be a practice that all of us implement into our routine and check on those around us. Over the past nine to ten weeks, we have been looking at Soul Shift. The challenges of the seven shifts are valuable to challenge us and to keep us in alignment with the call of God. As believers, we are called to make disciples, baptizing them into all belief and maturity in Christ. It's not a quick dunk, bam, you are fixed forever. It is such a process of growing, pruning, growing, pruning, becoming fruitful, multiplying, growing, pruning, becoming more fruitful, and so on and so forth. I think you get the picture.

The benefit of CPR during Covid was that it challenged us to focus outward and not solely inward. We had to stay convex and battle the pull, demands, and challenges of allowing our lives to become inward-focused. Isolation, Individuality, and the Institutionalism of the situation caused us to become "me" focused. The challenge of the CPR – Call, Pray, and Report, caused us to look outside of our homes, cross the street, the yard, the phone lines, and check on one another. It gave us the opportunity to practice the Me to We Shift. The community connections are and were important. Yet, here we are a few years later and the pace of things has gotten faster, and faster. The connections have become less important and we may have fallen back into the Me mindset.

One of the Soul Shifts was from Sheep to Shepherd. Ironically, the CPR also addressed this area. When we were calling on individuals, praying with them, and reporting their needs and cares back to the Church Office, we acted as Shepherds and not Sheep. As I was wrapping up the series of Soul Shift, I stated that we needed to be intentional, oddly enough, that is what Shepherd was, intentional. We proactively made the effort to check on those around us and pray with them, care for their needs, or simply, check in and brighten their days.



So why do I bring up the CPR again? Why? Because we need it still in our lives. As shepherds of the flock of God, we have work to do. We are called to remember and live out CPR. Christ Preached and Reproducing! We are to be nurturing sheep and raising them from lambs to maturity, so that the sheep may produce more sheep. The food that causes sheep to reproduce is Christ preached. We need to offer Christ in our daily lives. Whether it is a phone call, a meal, a helping hand, or whatever the situation calls for, we are called to offer and build others up in Christ. This means we have to be intentional in our process. As we go into the Book of Galatians in the upcoming weeks, once again we see Paul, preaching Christ and how it reproduced. Paul makes it clear that the true Gospel is Christ dying for our sins, being resurrected and seated at the right hand of the Father. We then are called to live a life of belief, faith, and commitment to Christ. We then are to become mature in Christ through the process of growing, learning, leading, and becoming shepherds in the Kingdom of God. So CPR is still an important need in our midst. Christ Preached and Reproduced, in us and in others.

Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer, and reflected on "Soul Shift" to date. Next sermon on "Ask to Listen". Good feedback overall.

SECRETARY REPORT:

Terri Goodwin read the Secretary's Report from June 2023 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio. Correction to Page 1 cleared balance. Should be \$64,788.59.

Joe Lammers moved to accept the minutes with correction. Diane Greer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT:

Pastor Ed Rinehart reviewed the Treasurers report for the period ending June 30, 2023.

Beginning balance was \$64,788.59.

Miscellaneous decreases totaled \$760.26.

Checks and payments cleared equaled \$5970.21, deposits and credits totaled equaled \$9,085.00 for a cleared balance of \$67,143.12.

Page 2 showed an un-cleared balance of \$65,953.35.

<u>Page 3</u> showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$65,420.16.

Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of June.

Total Income was \$8,468.62. The expense total was \$7,567.14, for a net loss/gain of \$901.48.

Page 5 showed all bills for the month of July.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled \$6,375.52. Bills yet to be paid totaled \$1,035.00, and the total is \$7,410.52.

Terri Goodwin moved to accept the report and to pay all bills for the month.

Parker Manger seconded the motion. Motion passed.

September - Gideon's International - Gideons is a group of Christian individuals dedicated to spreading God's Word through personal testimony, placing & distributing Bibles & New Testaments, jail ministry, & many other aspects of spreading the Word of God.

October - Operation Christmas Child (OCC) - OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international Christian relief & evangelism organization. The mission of OCC is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world & together with the local church share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

This is also known as the Shoebox program. In October & November, we will be participating in Operation Christmas Child by filling shoeboxes with small gifts, etc. for children. The money collected in October will then be used for shipping & the Gospel materials for these boxes. Our shoebox collection deadline is November 12. After which, the boxes will be taken to a collection point for processing and shipment to countries around the world. The Gospel materials will also be added.

An important aspect of this program is prayer. Without prayer, the shoebox is just a box of things. With prayer, the shoebox becomes an opportunity to share about the love of Jesus, thus providing a life changing experience for the child and their family. We will be praying over the Shoeboxes and dedicating them in our Worship Service on November 12. You are encouraged to pray over the Shoebox you create. Ask God what items should be added? Pray for the person receiving the Shoebox, God knows them. Pray for the impact on every hand that handles the Shoebox.

November - YES FM Ministries - YES FM is a Christian nonprofit radio station geared to youth & young adults & the station's Christian music is reflective of that age group. They reach many areas in northwest & west central Ohio, as well as southeast Michigan. YES FM is also able to broadcast on the internet & minister to people nationally & globally. Adult Class #1 will be in the Kitchen. This class will have a series of teachings "Through the Bible" by Les Feldick. He is a farmer rancher who loves to teach straight out of the Bible. No workbook or homework is required for our class, just bring your Bible!

Adult Class #2 will be in the room beside the Sound booth at the back of the sanctuary and will be studying the Book of Romans for a 12-week series. You will have a study book.
