## Expressions of Immanuel Church

Dear Church Family,

Grace is a topic of choice for October's Newsletter. During October and November, we will be looking at Philip Yancey's book, "What's So Amazing about Grace?"



It is as scripture reminds us, "that we are saved by grace through faith!" That faith is in Jesus Christ. It is as we believe in the wonderful works of Christ Jesus, His loving selfless sacrifice on the Cross as the sacrificial lamb to fulfill the sin requirements of the Law, that we find salvation. It is through our faith, our act of believing in Jesus Christ, not just once in a lifetime, but living and believing in Christ daily that the gift of God's grace is extended to our sin-sick souls and lives. Let me say it this way, it is as we live daily for Christ, believing in His love, sacrifice, and forgiveness, that we are washed and made new by the grace we receive.

So how amazing is grace? God's grace doesn't run out! Think of a balance scale. On one side are all of the sins you have ever committed. On the other side are all the sins you have repented of and asked forgiveness for and the grace of God that covers those sins. Yes, we have sins that we know we have committed, and yes there are sins and offenses that we may not know that we have committed. When we repent of our sins and ask God to cleanse us and forgive us of our sins, He cleanses both the known and unknown sins. But we continue to sin! So we need to continually seek God, His forgiveness and grace. Yet, Christ continues to add grace to the scale to make sure that we are not left short and lopsided toward sin. Christ balances us!

Yet, Philip Yancey sees a problem with Christians and the Christian Church. As a minister, as a Christian, and as a person, I have seen, felt, and experienced the "ungrace" that Philip Yancey writes about. The unforgiveness, the judgment, and the unloving responses from Christians. No, I am not going to give you names, dates, and places, although some of the wounds would be easy to identify and share. Even when a person is "doing good", it is easy to cause offenses. It happens daily and often it is brushed off by others as "no big deal". But past scars, past wounds, and past moments of "ungrace" can cause all of the fears, pain, and anxiety to the surface, making those moments "big deals". It is in these moments, that grace given to others becomes hard to muster. When grace, love, and thought are not shown to you, it is hard to return to the others causing the offense.

I attended a Moody Pastor's Conference in Chicago a number of years ago. Each day we heard messages and teachings to encourage and grow us. They were excellent and gave food for thought. We also had opportunities to go to smaller breakout sessions and talk more about certain topics. One day, I attended a session on "God and your city." I walked into the room with a group of other pastors and people who were attending the conference. I took my seat and was making light conversation with those around me. You know the drill, where are you from, what size church do you pastor, how are things going? The person leading the session walked into the room with tattoos on his hands, neck, arms, and face. My jaw must have dropped to the floor. (I don't hide my opinions well in my facial expressions, poker player, I am not.) The gentleman began with the simple statement something to the effect of the following: "I can touch more lives looking like this in my city, in the drug-infested, homeless, and crime-stricken areas than any of you who are lily white and have no marks. I accepted Christ after I had the tattoos and they have become an avenue to reach others who don't feel welcome in your congregations." Wow! Talk about a moment of "ungrace"! Push me over with a feather.

So how about it, do we offer grace? Do we show "ungrace"? Christ's death on the Cross is for all humanity, mistakes, blemishes, wrong decisions, situations that cause brokenness and you name it! Yes, Christ died for the ungodly which you and I once were and are seeking to no longer be. But one step is needed by every person to receive that grace, no great the amount needed or how small, we all have to accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, what he did upon the Cross for our sins, and understand that one day we will be resurrected perfected in Christ. Until then, we still need Christ's grace to be added daily as we seek to walk more like Him. So what is "So Amazing About Grace"? We are still works in progress!

**<u>Page 3</u>** showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total <u>\$66,352.59.</u>

Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of July.

Total Income was <u>\$9477.16</u>. The expense total was <u>\$9,387.96</u>, for a net loss/gain of <u>\$89.20</u>.

Page 5 showed all bills for the month of August.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled  $\frac{4,254.22}{54.22}$ . Bills yet to be paid totaled  $\frac{2,822.52}{52}$ , and the total is  $\frac{7,076.74}{5.22}$ .

**October - Operation Christmas Child (OCC) -** OCC is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international Christian relief & evangelism organization. The mission of OCC is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world & together with the local church share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

This is also known as the Shoebox program. In October & November, we will be participating in Operation Christmas Child by filling shoeboxes with small gifts, etc. for children. Directions and shoeboxes will be provided in October. This is a great time to be involved in the full mission of the Church. The money collected in October will then be used for shipping & the Gospel materials for these boxes. Our shoebox collection deadline is November 12. After that, the boxes will be taken to a collection point for processing and shipment to countries around the world. The Gospel materials will also be added.

An important aspect of this program is prayer. Without prayer, the shoebox is just a box of things. With prayer, the shoebox becomes an opportunity to share the love of Jesus, thus providing a life-changing experience for the child and their family. We will be praying over the Shoeboxes and dedicating them in our Worship Service on November 12. You are encouraged to pray over the Shoebox you create. Ask God what items should be added. Pray for the person receiving the Shoebox, God knows them. Pray for the impact on every hand that handles the Shoebox.

**November - YES FM Ministries -** YES FM is a Christian nonprofit radio station geared to youth & young adults & the station's Christian music is reflective of that age group. They reach many areas in northwest & west central Ohio, as well as southeast Michigan. YES FM is also able to broadcast on the internet & minister to people nationally & globally. They pray, give testimonies, and talk seriously about having a relationship with Jesus Christ. Their radio frequency for our area is 89.3 and their website is www.yeshome.com. Through all the pressures & struggles that face teens & young adults in our culture, YESFM strives to be a positive Christian influence, demonstrating the love & hope that is found in Jesus Christ!

**December - Rustic Hope** - A nonprofit, located in rural Russia Ohio. They are Christ-centered, familyfocused, and strongly pro-life. Rustic Hope provides free support to single mothers before, during, and after delivery. This support includes furniture, basic household items, food, vehicles, and baby items of all sorts. Rustic Hope primarily serves a six-county area, often getting referrals from other agencies. Donations of all sorts are very much appreciated and volunteers are welcomed.
