Dear Church Family,

The leaves are turning colors, the air is getting cooler and fall is definitely in the air. In the not-so-far distance, we can hear the sleigh bells of Christmas jingling just down the road.



During October we spoke a lot about God's grace. We spoke of how God's grace is a call to celebration, a call to life and joy. It is a rejoicing. We have spoken of brokenness, strife, and unforgiveness. We have highlighted the pain of disagreements, the words of hate, separation, and discord. We shared stories and have been reminded in Scripture of the lost sheep brought home by a loving shepherd, of the parable of the prodigal son who returns home to be a servant in his father's house. We have talked about the "Math of Grace" and as we have noted, God's grace and our sins don't add up. God gives out His grace in proportion to our sins, so that we may be justified by our faith in Christ. Whether our request for forgiveness comes in the final moments of life or along the way, God's grace is supplied.

The other day, I overheard a conversation where a youth was sharing how they worry about being perfect, being successful, and not failing in life. Those are honestly, big worries to be carrying. As the conversation continued, another youth shared their worries. I had to stop for a moment. Was I listening to adults concerned about life and the challenges that we face daily, or to youth, already burdened by the pressures of this world? Ironically, God's word reminds us that we are not going to add one day to our lives through worry. Yes, we need to be proactive in our lives, we are to be more like ants than grasshoppers. We are to store up for ourselves and make plans but do it without over-burdensome worry. If God cares for the birds, animals, trees, flowers, and items of His creation, will not God care for us and feed us, clothe us, and care for our basic needs?

So maybe in the month of November, we can do a few things that cause a little rejoicing!

Who can you help to heal a broken relationship?

Who can you forgive and take the first step?

Who can you offer God's love, grace, and truth to so that they may find a reason to rejoice this Thanksgiving? What can you do to encourage a person who is filled with worry, carrying too much of a burden, or feeling a little overwhelmed with life?

What can you do to bring a spirit of thankfulness and rejoicing back into a person's life?

November begins with Jack-o-lanterns on front porches and ends with families eating Pumpkin Pie together around a Thanksgiving table. Allow the grace of God to touch your life, to touch the lives of others, and to fill your conversations with rejoicing. Great is the banquet feast when all the people are gathered together and celebrating the blessings of God.

Mark Elsass called the meeting to order. Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer.

SECRETARY REPORT:

Terri Goodwin read the Secretary's Report from the August 2023 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio. Two corrections to Treasurer's Report: Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of July (not June). Page 5 showed bills for the month of August (not July).

Joe Lammers moved to accept the minutes with corrections made to the Treasurer's Report.

Diane Greer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT:

Ginger Holtkamp reviewed the treasurer's report for the period ending August 31, 2023.

Beginning balance was \$68,095.54.

Miscellaneous decreases totaled \$982.66.

Checks and payments cleared equaled \$6,782.50, and deposits and credits totaled equaled \$9,319.71 for a cleared balance of \$69,650.09.

Page 2 showed an un-cleared balance of \$63,229.54.

<u>Page 3</u> showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$64,675.65.

Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of August.

Total Income was \$8,410.31. The expense total was \$9,333.25, for a net loss of \$-922.94.

Page 5 showed all bills for the month of September.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled <u>\$5,852.38</u>. Bills yet to be paid totaled <u>\$1,411.25</u>, and the total is \$7,263.63.

Joe Lammers moved to accept the report and pay all monthly bills.

Diane Greer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor's Items in Review:

The Maurer and Bensman weddings went well.

Made two hospital visits.

A new circuit board was purchased at \$3052.50 for the organ. Until now, no major expenses had been made for the organ since its initial purchase in the late 70's/early 80's.

Lots of good things happening in the life of Immanuel Church!

TRUSTEE REPORT:

Carson Manger reported that lights in Sunday school room were installed. Pondering a "paint day" for the Sunday school room. An extra light purchased was installed near the elevator. Was noted that the Kettlersville Well Association would be raising the church's share of water bill to \$45-50. The roof of stoop is still on "to do" list.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Benevolence and Outreach: Met the first week of September. The sign was changed on the front lawn.

Operation Christmas Child has begun. June's benevolence will support Epiphany ministries.

Care and hospitality: October 8th there will be a carry-in luncheon.

Decorating: Nothing until Advent

Worship: No meeting

Education: Will meet in October to review September. 45-50 in attendance on Rally Day.

<u>Constitution:</u> Up-date on the first meeting held Tuesday, September 5th. Wording, grammar, and consistency of wording throughout were corrected. Other reflections shared, are to be considered as reviews continue in the next meetings.

<u>Youth:</u> Good first meeting attended by 8-10 youth. Prayer boards were made. A main focus of the youth group in the coming year will be keeping prayer and Bible reading a part of daily/weekly life of growing in personal faith.

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> The steering committee for the Cancer Support Ministry met three times. Many conversations, thoughts, and ideas were shared. The Consistory approved the proposal of the Cancer Support Group Ministry and dates/plans for this ministry will be shared with the congregation soon.
