Dear Church Family,

May we fill the sanctuary with voices like a choir of angels! May we make it a priority to travel from afar, like the Magi in the days following to witness and bring gifts to the Christ child? May we gather with our Church family to celebrate the anniversary of the birth of Christ, the light of the world coming into the world for us? May we celebrate the greatest gift given to humanity and more importantly to each one of us, Jesus? So as you shop for gifts, enjoy school band and choir concerts, attend work Christmas parties, and schedule your holidays full of items, please find time to reflect on the days gone by. Reflect on the people who have passed away over these past years, how they have touched your life, and remember their hope in this life. Merry Christmas!

Mark Elsass called the meeting to order. Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer.

SECRETARY REPORT:

Pastor Ed read the Secretary's Report from the September 2023 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio.

Ginger Holtkamp moved to accept the minutes. Joe Lammers seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT:

Ginger Holtkamp reviewed the treasurer's report for the period ending September 30, 2023.

No Reconciliation report is available as the Bank Statement has not been received as of the meeting.

<u>First page of the Treasurers report is the Financial Overview.</u> It showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total <u>\$67,059.04</u>

Page 2 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of September.

Total Income was \$7,524.00. The expense total was \$5461.10, for a net gain of \$2062.90.

<u>Page 3</u> showed all bills for the month of September.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled \$7,652.04. Bills yet to be paid totaled \$1,411.26, and the total is \$9063.30.

Carson Manger moved to accept the report and pay all monthly bills.

Ned Meyer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Ed reviewed the current calendar and functions that are happening. Updated the Consistory on different ministry items and dates. Pastor Ed then shared a reading called The Pastor's View and the navigation of visioning in the midst of crisis within minutes of each other. Pastor Ed reminded the Consistory that the employees are all part-time staff and work in their work at the Church around the other needs in their lives. We need to be aware of time, availability, and if we see things that need to be completed to offer a helping hand. Pastor Ed also reviewed the Calendar through the end of 2023, Worship and Sunday School attendance tracking, and gave a copy of the proposed schedule with messages for 2024.

TRUSTEE REPORT:

Ned Meyer reviewed items for Trustees, We are getting other quotes for Church Insurance. A review of the 2024 Budget has begun. Bill for the Drainage around the Church Parsonage was presented and the motion to send it to the Congregational Meeting was approved. All the old chairs and old wood tables have been removed and rearranging that area has started. The roof over the Basement Door is yet to be replaced. Life Vac is now in a bag in the kitchen. Some Plaster works are being looked at for 2024. I had a furnace issue and it was quickly repaired by Steve and Ted's. Furnaces have also been maintained.

Benevolence and Outreach:

Care and hospitality: Luncheon Pastor/Teacher Appreciation well.

Decorating: Nothing until Advent Poinsettia has been ordered.

Worship: Questions about the broadcast came up and the committee will need to meet.

Education:

<u>Constitution:</u> The Consistory reviewed the thoughts and processes of the feedback from the breakout sessions.

One final change can solve some issues on timing. The consistory discussed to move the Congregational

meeting from the 2nd Sunday of November to the 3rd Sunday of November so that the Congregational Meeting will always fall after the November Consistory Meeting. Joe Lammers made the motion to make this final change and present it to the Congregation. Parker Manger Seconded the Motion. The motion Passed. Youth:

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> The first Cancer Support Group Meeting met and we are moving forward with this ministry. Nominations for 2024 were discussed. We will continue to fill the positions.

Goals for 2024 were reviewed and passed. Joe Lammers moved to accept the goals, Carson Manger seconded the motion.

Ginger moved to adjourn the consistory meeting.

December 2023 - Rustic Hope - A nonprofit, located in rural Russia Ohio. They are Christ-centered, family-focused, and strongly pro-life. Rustic Hope provides free support to single mothers before, during, and after delivery. This support includes furniture, basic household items, food, vehicles, and baby items of all sorts. Rustic Hope primarily serves a six-county area, often getting referrals from other agencies. Donations of all sorts are very much appreciated and volunteers are welcomed. Rustic Hope - Because every life matters!

Giving Tree - end of November/December - The giving tree in the back of the church is for Rustic Hope. Please take one or more tags from the tree, purchase the items, and bring them back to church, unwrapped. Some of the items needed include diapers, wet wipes, shampoo/conditioner, laundry detergent, toilet paper, kid's socks, and kid's winter boots. Rustic Hope is our December benevolence recipient and cash donations may be given via the Benevolent offering throughout the month of December. All items should be brought to church by December 24.

January 2024 - FISH (Friends In Service to Humanity) - Their mission is to provide emergency assistance to the needy people residing in Shelby County in the form of food, clothing, medicine, and other necessities. Besides the food pantry, FISH also has a thrift store. The thrift store is open to the public & they encourage everyone to come & shop. The proceeds from the store are then used to fulfill FISH's mission. They accept donations of clothing, linens, and household items for the thrift store. Donations of non-perishable food & personal care products are accepted for the food pantry. FISH is also looking for volunteers. FISH has been active in Shelby County since 1979 & Immanuel Church was one of the four churches to assist in the early years of this organization. FISH is located at 1128 W Michigan St, Sidney Ohio.

February 2024 - Epiphany Ministry of Ohio - Epiphany is an ecumenical Christian ministry for young men & women who are in custody at Juvenile Justice Facilities. Epiphany's purpose is to manifest God's love to incarcerated and troubled youth. Ginger Holtkamp is a member of the Epiphany team.
