In January we looked at the topics of:

There is a lot of information in these topics and it is easy to run ahead of these and simply move forward to the next topic. However, let's take a moment and realize how interlinked these topic are to our Christian Walk. Scripture tells us that we are to "work out our salvation with fear and trembling!" We then have a responsibility to examine our faith, live our faith and grow our faith. As stated in the beginning message, "we are either growing or dying!" This is a fact. Status quo is not something that we can hold very long. Take your arms, hold them in the air and keep them there forever. Nope, not going to happen! Gravity, age and circumstances won't let it occur. We can't hold our arms in the air by our own will power. Moses, as long as he held his arms in the air, the Israelites would be winning the battle. Once his arms began to fall or they were lowered, the Israelites would begin to fail in the battle. Henry Blackaby in the book, "Experiencing God", poses the statement, "Look around for God and see what He is doing and then go and join Him in it!" Instead of us doing our own thing and asking God to bless it, why don't we look for God and join Him in what He is already doing? Wow! What a concept! Being content is finding God and living in Him and His work on a daily basis.

Now none of the things of the previous paragraph come about on our own. We must learn these lesson of life, sometimes on our own, but more often than naught, we learn them from someone who already learned them and takes the time to teach us these life lessons. This is the role of being a disciple. We are willing to learn, be accountable, be engaged in the journey and "Be Alive" in the things of God. Discipleship is the learning and teaching. We are to be a disciple and a disciple-maker, all at the same time. Learning and teaching, growing and showing, being guided and guiding. It is the grand game of "Follow the Leader," Only it is Jesus who has called people over 2000 years ago to follow Him and they did. We are part of the long line of believers who have started the journey. So "Be Alive", "Be Bold", "Be Content" and "Be a Disciple"! I didn't say be a caboose! Don't be the last car! Disciple others and this world will be changed.

Joe Lammers called the meeting together. Asked Pastor Ed to open and he did with a prayer.

SECRETARY REPORT: Parker Manger read the Secretary's Report from November 2022 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio. Mark Elsass moved to accept the minutes, and Carson Manger seconded the motion. The motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT: Ginger Holtkamp reviewed the Treasurers report for the period ending November 30, 2022. The beginning balance was \$60,297.67, miscellaneous decreases totaled \$940.77, checks and payments which cleared were \$6,920.58 and the deposits and credits totaled \$8,299.67 for a cleared balance of \$60,735.99. Page 2 showed an uncleared balance of \$57,537.61. Page 3 showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$57,621.78. Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of November. Total Income was \$6,950.80. The expense total was \$7,895.61 for a net loss of \$944.81. Page 5 showed all bills for the month of December. At the time of consistory, the bills totaled \$5,598.92.

Ned Meyer moved to accept the report and to pay all bills for the month. Parker Manger second the motion, the motion passed.
