This is the challenge and theme for 2024! Time to Soar in '24! But how are we going to do that? In what areas are we going to be looking for growth, success, achievements, and our soaring?

One area will be in our Sunday School. It is the hope and desire to build an appetite for learning. We are to become hungry for the "Bread of Life". Sunday School,

Through Women 4 Christ, the women's retreat and their day together will be opportunities to be enriched and grow. Women's Guild as they gather to pray, have devotions, and grow stronger together. Wait and see is not a valid method of leading, discipling, and guiding sheep or people in this matter. Knowing the keys to salvation, and knowing avenues of building up individuals to aid them in their personal growth is important. This being said, we need to focus on our process of evangelism, our hospitality, our caregiving, and avenues of connection with people. Making our faith community stronger spiritually will also help to grow our faith community wider. Our impact will be greater, our passion will be deeper, our commitment will be stronger and the outcome will be exceptional. Not because we did more, but because we were obedient to the mission, the call, and the voice of God.

For us to soar, we need to love God with all of our hearts, with all of our minds, with all of our strength, and with all of our souls! Being fully invested, fully committed, and fully connected to God as a Church Family will bring about the true growth we all desire. So if we want to soar in 2024, we need to consider our effort to fly, to soar on the wings of eagles, to run and not grow weary, to walk and not be faint.

Mark Elsass called the meeting to order. Pastor Ed opened the meeting with prayer.

SECRETARY REPORT:

Terri Goodwin read the Secretary's Report from the October 2023 meeting held for Immanuel Church of Kettlersville, Ohio. Two corrections: Treasurer's Report - Terri Goodwin was not present at the October meeting. Trustee Report - Change wording from "I had a furnace issue", to "The church had". Ginger Holtkamp moved to accept the minutes with corrections made to Treasurer's Report. Dave Kettler seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURER REPORT:

Ginger Holtkamp reviewed the treasurer's report for the period ending October 31, 2023.

Beginning balance was \$66,015.28.

Miscellaneous decreases totaled (\$874.07).

Checks and payments cleared equaled \$8,715.08, and deposits and credits totaled equaled \$13,991.46 for a cleared balance of \$70,417.59.

Page 2 showed an un-cleared balance of \$58,561.51.

Page 3 showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$69,003.33.

Page 4 reviewed the income and expense detail report for the month of October.

Total Income was \$11,885.96. The expense total was \$9,935.21, for a net loss/gain of \$1950.75. Page 5 showed all bills for the month of October.

At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled \$15,860.31. Bills yet to be paid totaled \$1,740.91, and the total is \$17,601.22.

Parker Manger moved to accept the report and to pay all bills for the month. Terri Goodwin seconded the motion. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor's Items in Review:

Confirmation class has been reduced to 16 people at present. Final approved copy of revised Constitution is ready and in PDF Form. Pastor Ed will be off Sunday, December 31st to spend time with family. Gilberg-Hartwig Funeral Home is in process of coordinating Longest Night Blue Christmas service for December 21st. Discussion on options for tables/chairs, in North room in back of sanctuary, to allow for more usable space. Discussion of multiple storage areas for paper products, plastic utensils, etc. Can we combine, with input from various organizations, and set up possible Amazon account to replenish as needed, with Kelly overseeing and reordering. Parker Manger will look in to setting up an Amazon account. Cleaning out old Sunday School materials and Bibles with intention of these items being sent to ministry.
