



To the right is a picture with an important question. From the start of Lent, some forty days ago until now, we have been looking at Jesus as our shepherd, our commitment, our calling, our walk with Christ, and the outcomes of Easter, but what are you going to do with it?





over. Jesus will be celebrated for rising from the tomb, your sins are forgiven and the weather is looking awfully nice. Soon the grass will be growing, vacations will be arranged and off you will go into the world all over again. But what are you going to do with Jesus? This question still remains.

How are you going to shepherd? Spring is the time for new lambs to be born, to be nurtured, and to be raised. In the same way, new decisions to follow Christ need to be nurtured, fostered, fed, cared for, and guided. Oddly enough, we shut down Sunday school in the summer, we take a break from Church in the upcoming weeks, and we make plans to be away since the children are out of school. Maybe it isn't intentional, but we step back from our commitment to Christ and the Church and coast. Okay, you do those things, but can you plan for Jesus to go with you on vacation? Can you make plans to feed your family spiritually in the summer? Why certainly, there are great opportunities to spend time together as a family around a campfire, with friends over in the summer, and take 30 minutes to have some devotion and study and design God to be part of your conversation.

In fact, I am planning some bicycle rides with a friend and we are talking about having a few others join in on occasions and then afterward have a cookout. Time to talk, visit, and build our relationships deeper and stronger. What would happen if we planned Jesus into our summer activities with our families, our friends, and our neighbors? Family, food, fun, and Christian fellowship can lead to great conversation, the nurturing of our children, and more. A few years ago, Dietrich and some buddies did Friday night fires at the barn. They would have a short bible lesson, and discussion and then have Christian music, fun, and fellowship around the fire afterward. Those unplanned discussions opened up the doors to talk about Jesus in a non-threatening way.

What will you do? How will you let Jesus in on the summer activities and use your home as a base of operation for the gospel? It's ironic that as you read the New Testament, the number of times that Jesus was at someone's home and people were healed, the message of the Gospel was presented and people believed or lives were profoundly impacted because of the casual setting. Conversely, when Jesus was at the Temple, the Leaders caused a stir, not saying that our church leaders are or would cause a stir, but the setting is completely different.

I know, Pastor Ed you are suggesting that we plan. Sort of, but I would ask that you consider letting God change your home into a resource for the Kingdom of God. That in your spontaneity of things, you make room for God to work in unique and profound ways, that you let your children see that God is a priority in your household, that you model for them speaking to friends about Jesus, and that you invite them into the conversation about Jesus as well. I think the most exciting thing about Confirmation Class is not the outcome of our youth, although this is exciting, but the impact on the adults. It's interesting the conversations that we have in which our children listen to us and learn from us about our faith and our journey. To me, it gives them the confidence to fail and the ability to come back to Christ with renewed and stronger confidence.

So what do you say? What will you do with Jesus this summer?

Immanuel Church of Kettlersville Minutes from February 13, 2024

Attendance: Mark Elsass, Pastor Ed Rinehart, Parker Manger, Ginger Holtkamp, Dave Kettler, Matt Wick, Diane Greer, Missy Wells, Paul Bambauer and Dawn Dabbelt

Parker asked Pastor Ed to open the meeting with reading and prayer.

Secretary's Report – Dawn read the Consistory Minutes for the January 9, 2024 meeting. Dave K. made a motion to accept the minutes as read, Paul B. seconded and the motion passed.

Treasurer's Report – Ginger reviewed the treasurer's report for the period ending Jan 31, 2024. Beginning balance was \$65,083.23. Miscellaneous decreases totaled \$925.41. Checks and payments cleared equaled \$11,092.37. Deposits and credits totaled \$10,095.60 for a cleared balance of \$63,161.05. The reconciliation page showed an un-cleared balance of \$57,960.58 and showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$57.960.58. Income and Expense Details were listed for January. At the time of consistory, bills paid totaled \$6,937.58. Bills yet to be paid \$1,451.97. Total for January expense \$8,389.55. Missy W. made the motion to accept, and Carson M. seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report -

- Lots of positives going on in our church. Sunday School attendance is nearly running at 50% of our Worship attendance. The depth of learning is happening. Teachers are learning from teachers, plans are coordinated, and ideas are shared.
- We are blessed with a variety of musicians during our services and we have youth stepping out of their comfort zone and playing in front of the congregation. They are succeeding and excelling.
- Our viewership on Facebook and YouTube has increased. Facebook is hitting over 200 views per week already in 2024. He asked all to share the broadcast with friends and family. We don't know who needs it at the very moment.
- Spiritual growth is happening. Spiritual depth is happening.
- Update Confirmation class winding down. We have three youths who will be received into membership on Easter, March 31.
- Cody Gish will be sharing this coming Sunday, Feb 18 as Pastor is on vacation.
- Attendance update this year's averages are in-house 79.8, Facebook 176.8, YouTube 26, and Fall Sunday School 45. Sunday School to Worship attendance compares to 56.78% of our average worship attendance.
- Maundy Thursday, March 28 Seder Supper. They will be having the 4th-6th grade students receive the Seder meal with the congregation participating in the service.
- Good Friday the Church will be open (March 29) and Easter is March 31.
- Need to complete Membership Review and Audit for 2023 Year End.

Trustee's Report

- Carson M. will set up for Audit report to be done as soon as possible.
- Bartenstein Scholarship 5 people estimated, able to give \$900 to each individual.
- Elevator inspection variance/compliance passed. Ned Meyer met with inspectors and maintenance last week in Paul B's absence.

Committee Reports:

Benevolent and Outreach – changed our March Benevolent to Bevin Stein. We had a change of heart after listening to his story during the January Women's Guild. We are still in need of 2 people to assist. Care and Outreach – Ginger H. gave an overview of the upcoming - Widow/Widower Luncheon Wed, Feb 14. They have two speakers. One will be discussing Parkinson's and not sure what the other is sharing. Next month's speaker will be on scams. They are also in need of two additional people to assist. Joann Shroyer has volunteered to continue doing cards through February. Lisa Manger will step up to assist.

Decorating – Pastor Ed indicated that Easter flowers are being ordered this week.

Worship – Pastor Ed advised that nothing has been done on microphones, bulletins being finished for March, and worship set.

Education – Parker M. advised no update.

Youth – Souper bowl went well. The soups were delicious. Overall, they are having good attendance for the youth.

Shepherd's Sheep – Cancer Support Ministry – 2 in attendance. Keep in prayer.

Old Business:

- Open Committee Positions: 2 spots for Benevolent and Outreach and 2 for Care & Hospitality
- Church Rental Process, Tabled until next month.
- Kettlersville Well Association –Carson M., Matt W., and Mark E. attended the Well Association meeting. Asked the Association if they would consider changing the rate back to residential and a member of the association advised that all other area churches are being charged a commercial rate. Our consistory has been tasked to inquire with other churches about their rates. Paul inquired with the town of New Knoxville and they advised that NK Methodist is paying a residential rate and the First Church is paying a commercial rate due to their size and activities being held. It was noted that the keys have been returned.

New Business:

• Diane G. asked about opening up the nursery again and what would it take. Two people would be needed. 1 Adult and 1 10-year-old+ child. The consistory will ask people if they are interested in assisting with this.

Mark E. recapped information regarding the constitution and that they had 3 open invites to discuss the constitution. It was asked to Mark E. about adding something in our constitution regarding pro-life. It was asked to wait until the proposed constitution was approved before seeking additional amendments. It was decided that the start of the March meeting would look deeper at the request. Mark E. made a motion to invite to present their thoughts and concerns, and Missy W. seconded. Motion passed.
