Attendance: Mark Elsass, Pastor Ed Rinehart, Parker Manger, Ginger Holtkamp, Dave Kettler, Matt Wick, Diane Greer, Missy Wells, Paul Bambauer, Carson Manger and Dawn Dabbelt

Mark called the meeting to order and asked Pastor Ed to open the meeting with reading and prayer.

An Immanuel member was in attendance to discuss the possibility of adding additional items to our Statement of Faith. We listened and advised that we would discuss the request. Consistory did discuss the topics presented and it was suggested that we talk to family and friends for input and report back next month.

Secretary's Report was reviewed. Mark E. made a motion to accept the report and it was seconded by Paul B. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Beginning balance of \$63,161.05 ending Feb. 29, 2024. Miscellaneous decreases totaled \$1508.60. Checks and payments cleared equaled \$10,173.26. Deposits and credits totaled \$9449.94 for a cleared balance of \$60,928.79. The reconciliation page showed an un-cleared balance of \$58,218.67 and showed all increases and decreases in the unrestricted and restricted bank accounts to now total \$60,526.62. Income and Expense details were listed for February. At the time of consistory, bills total \$4314.24. Total March expenses \$11,682.20. Diane G made a motion to accept and seconded by Missy W. Motion passed.

Pastors Report

- Sunday School is running at 50% of the Worship Attendance Average.
- Confirmation class is concluding, and we will be refining speeches and preparing for Palm Sunday.
- Scheduled out of town on Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday, March 26 & 27
- The Average attendance for worship is 88.8, the average size for Sunday School is 44.4 and the overall in-house and online ministry is reaching an average of 274.4. (We only count one view person and we know of situations with multiple viewers per view.)

 Update items –
- Leslie and I working on Maundy Thursday, March 28 with Seder Supper. This will take place in the sanctuary and the meal will be served to the 4-6 grade Sunday School Class. There will be multiple points of interaction for the congregation and individuals to assist in the service. Holy Communion will be served during the service for all in attendance who desire to partake.
- Good Friday the Church will be open (March 29) and Easter is March 31st.
- Easter flowers and palms have been ordered.
- Following the Easter Sermon, topics will be lighter as we review basics that may help us to share the Gospel more readily.

Trustee's Report:

- Carson reported that the audit report has been finalized.
- Bartenstein Scholarship to be dispersed to those who applied

Decorating Committee:

• Easter flowers and palm branches ordered. Kids will parade around the church.

Care and Hospitality:

- Ginger said the meeting is this Thursday and the Widow and Widowers luncheon is being held tomorrow.
- Also advised that she is visiting prison at least once a month.

• Parker informed that he is working on a plan.

Youth: Reviewing what is working and not working. Moving along well.
